A. Removal of our sin (vv.7-9; See also Hebrews 9:19-22, John 19:28-30)

B. Renewal of our heart (vv.10-13; See also I Peter 2:9)

3. The Color of Righteousness

(Psalm 51:14-19)

A. Salvation of David (vv.14-17; See also II Samuel 7:4-17)

B. Completion of God’s City (vv.18-19; See also Revelation 21:3)
